THE before, during, and after OF A SESSION

If you're wondering what to expect from your time with mQn Photography, look no further! I specialize in creating a personalized experience for you and your family that's fun and meaningful. Although the goal of working together is to create wonderful images, I also strive to make the process of getting there enjoyable and memorable! Here's how it works.

1

questionnaire

Every session begins with an initial questionnaire so I can get to know your family. Answer the best you can. I want to learn more about you and your family and your goals for the portrait session. I also encourage clients to e-mail me with any questions and ideas.

2

booking the date

Once you've decided on the right photography session for your family, we'll go ahead and get the date booked! We'll work with your schedule to find a perfect day and time for the session! Most sessions are scheduled within two hours of sunset or mid day if scheduling an in home session.

3

taking pictures

On the day of your session, we'll meet at the agreed location and time and start snapping away! A portrait session can take anywhere from 1-2 hours. There's really no rush - or general time limit - just what feels natural. It generally takes at least 30 minutes for us to 'warm up' together, meaning getting comfortable and feeling relaxed in front of (or behind!) the lens. After that, it's really up to the photographed subject as to how long the session will last. This is the fun part - let me do the work!

4

on-line ordering session

The photos have been taken, individually re-touched with great love and care, and now it's time for you to see the end result of all our hard work and planning! Two weeks after your session you will be shown appx. 25 images through an online password protected gallery. At this point in time, you'll have the opportunity to choose the photographs you would like to have as prints, albums, canvas, or a variety of other handcrafted photo products we offer. I will attach a product guide to the e-mail with your password for viewing. You will have 1 month to ask questions, place orders, and be excited about your images.



IDEAS & INSPIRATION:

choosing your location & picking props

choosing a location

The location of your photoshoot can be anywhere - from your bedroom to a nearby park or in the studio. At mQn Photography I believe the most important factor in choosing a location should be its emotional value to you and your family. Being in the same spot something wonderfully memorable happened in the past can evoke strong emotions and great moments in front of the lens (think first kiss, a special "I love you" moment, first date, etc.). Natural settings, such as parks and wilderness, can create beautiful backdrops for photographs. If you prefer your photoshoot indoors, rooms with big windows and lots of light are always a great choice! One more reason to love my studio. picking out props

Props are any kind of object or item included in photographs. In general, props can add detail, interest, and meaning to your images, especially when they hold sentimental value to you or your family. Ideas include hats, baby blankets or wraps, love letters, heirloom furniture, a vintage dress handed down in the family, old photographs, handkerchiefs, shoes, a suitcase, travel souvenirs, or anything else that's close to your heart. I love working with props; if you have questions or need ideas, just ask!



If you're not too keen on the idea of a traditional, posed family photoshoot, adding props into the mix adds an element of fun to the shoot. Props allow you to be playful during the photoshoot as the photographer captures genuine moments between you and your loved ones.

Below are some prop ideas for your next family photo session.

1. Get your noses in some books. Love reading? Have each of your family members bring along their favorite book that can be incorporated into some of the shots. Lay on a blanket reading or have each one of your family members peep over the edge of their book.
2. Use the holidays. Christmas is a great time for your next photoshoot and there are so many options when it comes to choosing props. Have each family member wear a Christmas hat or wrap yourselves in Christmas lights for a warm and bright effect.
3. Bring out the chalkboards. Write a date or message on chalkboards of various sizes to incorporate something personalized into the shoot.
4. Get cozy. If your children are still quite young, bring a few blankets along so that you can cuddle together as a family, share a few laughs and get some great pictures.
5. Print out props. If you want to add some fun to the shoot and get your kids laughing, why not print out a few props such as mustaches, glasses, speech bubbles and hats that you can glue onto wooden sticks and use in the shoot. There are tons of free printables online so it's a very affordable option too.
6. Frame your faces. Get a few frames of different sizes and colors together that can be used to pose for your next family shoot.
7. Keep it natural. If your family photos will be shot outdoors, remember that nature gives you so much to work with. Flowers, trees, grass and water all make for beautiful backdrops and add something extra special to your photos.

Remember to always have fun at your photo session so your photographer can really capture the spirit of your family.

IDEAS & INSPIRATION:

session themes

Depending on the age of your children and what you'd like to accomplish in your photo session, we have a wide variety of session themes and ideas to offer you! If you'd like to come up with a unique session theme for your family or child, we'd love to get creative with you! Here are a few popular ideas based on experience with past clients.



newborn 1-14 days old

Newborn sessions capture your precious baby just days after their arrival. We have two session styles - "lifestyle" and "posed". Lifestyle sessions focus on baby in his natural surroundings, non-posed, sometimes with Mom and Dad in the photos as well. Posed sessions may take quite a bit longer and result in photographs where baby looks like a sweet, sleeping doll. We love both styles of newborn sessions and will work with you to get the newborn photos of your dreams!



happy baby up to 1 year

Baby sessions can be loads of fun and loads of work for everyone, but these sweet photos will quickly become family heirlooms! Baby sessions can be in a variety of themes, styles, and locations - anything from in-the-nude on a soft wool rug to costumes in the outdoors! Props, cute outfits, and interesting locations are welcomed.



indoor explorer toddler

For children a bit older but still a bit young to brave the cold weather, indoor play exploration sessions are a perfect way to capture your child's personality while piquing their curiosity. We'll work with you to plan a fun indoor activity. Indoor play sessions prevent mid-session tantrums by allowing your child to play and set the pace of the shoot.



snow all ages

Winter is the only time to get beautiful snow images. Pick out your best outerwear and head outside. Whether its actually snowing or not imagine your adorable child having a fun play date in the snow - and getting photos to document it all! Snow sessions work best as 30 minute mini sessions just enough time to play and have fun before the cold starts to set in.

IT'S THE DAY OF MY SESSION

what, exactly

should I expect

If this is your family's first time working with a professional photographer, it can be difficult to know what to expect. What should I bring? Will there be enough time to get the perfect picture? Will my child feel uncomfortable in front of the camera? I completely understand these feelings of concern; you are not alone! I am here to work for and with you to make your session as stress-free as possible. Remember, this is supposed to be fun!

My method of working is simple: I tailor my photography to you and your family. Each session is a unique experience, built from the ground up just for you. In our initial consultation, we'll discuss things like the family schedule, favorite locations, and attention spans to make your photo day a smashing success. This is your day to relax and enjoy your family; I'll do the rest!



scheduling

Planning in advance is the key to success!

During the winter if you want that lovely fresh snow we need to get out there as soon as it hits. Be prepared and ready to go at a moments notice. Let me know that you want a snow session so I can put you on a waitlist. Sessions are scheduled within two hours before the sunsets which in the winter happen quite early. I am here to make your session a success, and will work with you individually to find a time and place that fits the family! If an outdoor session is out of the question: winter is a great time to do an indoor lifestyle session and these are scheduled mid-day.

weather

If we've chosen an outdoor location for your photos, we will most likely be at the mercy of the weather! If the day turns out to be extremely cold, which can be dangerous and frustrating for the family, we'll find an alternate date for the photos. Similarly, for rainstorms, windstorms or extreme heat, I'd rather reschedule than push everyone into an uncomfortable place! I will be in communication the day before and day of the session to discuss any challenges that may arise and deal with them in the most convenient way possible for your family.

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IT'S THE DAY OF MY SESSION

what, exactly

should I expect? cont'd

taking it slow

Children are unpredictable - a characteristic that makes them so lovable - but also difficult to plan around. It's something we completely understand! For this reason, we always carve out a large chunk of time to make sure your session isn't rushed. If baby needs to be changed or fed, take your time. If a toddler is getting tired or frustrated, we can take a snack break to relax and regroup. If you and your family are feeling uncomfortable or exhausted, we can pause for a drink of water and a rest in the shade. This is your photo session and we'll work at the pace of you and your family! There's no need to rush - just relax and enjoy the experience.

keeping it positive

It can be difficult to get kids to cooperate in the best of circumstances, and many times they may feel uncomfortable with a photographer they don't know well in an unfamiliar place. I work hard to get those perfect poses, but never with negative reinforcement or discipline. I use only positive, confidence-boosting methods to gain your child's trust and cooperation during the photoshoot, and ask parents that they do the same. I find that the best photographic results come from using the carrot rather than the stick!

safety first

When working with babies and children, safety is my first priority. When I photograph babies and newborns, I ask that mom and dad stay at arm's length to make sure baby's kept safe and sound under all circumstances. When planning an outdoor, on-location shoot with kids, I make sure the site is safe and suitable for children ahead of time. If there's any question as to whether or not a location, pose, or prop is safe for your family, I always err on the side of caution. And if mom or dad feel uncomfortable with the situation, I'm happy to find alternatives to make sure everyone is kept out of harm's way.
